But now no longer in the shade..of Cyprus!






Congratulations also to **Kath Smith** and **Brian Elbourne** who were runners up in the mixed triples competition at Herga.

Some of you will remember a former social member and Herga founder, Lily Barrett. Sadly she has passed away. Details of her funeral are as follows: 18th May 2017 at Breakspear Crematorium, East Chapel, 12.00 midday. Roy Wake remembers Lily as a lovely lady who always had a smile on face. He said the following "I have known Lily for over 20 years. She and her husband Frank regularly attended our Ladies Festivals. They were both very good ballroom dancers, which they thoroughly enjoyed. Frank and Ted Moyle were both key instigators in forming of Herga Indoor Bowls Club and were original directors. Lily was a very good bowler in her day. The restaurant is still named as the Frank Barrett restaurant. Lily continued to help out at Herga until about 3 or 4 years ago."

Similar sentiments were expressed by Sheilah Lowe.

"Lily and her husband worked tirelessly to make Herga successful. She came every year for enrolment and took all of our details meticulously, continuing after her husband Frank died. She enjoyed herself meeting us all and was such a lovely friendly person. We missed her when she was not able to come any more."

Jim Hughes will be attending Lily's cremation, to represent Herga and indeed Harrow as she was a social member at Harrow Bowls Club for many years.



More hospitality




Top rink went to Isabelita John, Fay Mortimer, Rex Freeman and Ian Gibbins.
