An important message from our President Mark Snell Support for our Captain ROY


Our club is extremely fortunate to have Roy Wake as our Captain. Over the years we have had many good Captains but none have worked harder than Roy. Not only does he ensure that he and Elaine have no holidays in the season but he also makes every effort to be at the club on Mondays and Wednesdays to both organise and play in the roll-up sessions and attends virtually every club night. He is also a member of the "Green Team" and cuts the grass every Wednesday morning throughout the season. All of this is in addition of the normal Captain's duties of putting selection sheets up, chairing the selection Committee, liaising with other clubs and captaining the teams in matches.

The Captain's job is a thankless task and Roy is now in his second year as Club Captain. Sunday 2nd July.






