The members of Harrow Bowls Club, always eager for a fun get together, attended en masse








And enjoyed a great spread of food

Parking: large car park next to green

Take the A329 to Ascot and at the roundabout immediately before the racecourse take the left turn heading for Windsor on the A332 (the racecourse will then be alongside you on your right). After going about half a mile go straight over the small 'double' roundabout. At the next roundabout (which is an elongated one with woods in the middle) keep in the right hand lane and take the second exit: driving through Windsor Great Park. On exiting the park, at the large roundabout in about 1/4 mile turn right (3rd exit) taking the A308 to Old Windsor and Staines. After about 100 yards drive over the Long Walk. The entrance to the grounds containing the bowling green is the first entrance about a quarter of a mile along on the left and signposted "Shaw Farm Gate". Inside is a small lodge and a barrier. <u>Car registration numbers and other details have to be advised before the day of the match-otherwise entry will be refused. The security staff will direct you to the green.</u>


