
Could Rex be asking Fay "Your place-or mine, and I'll show you my trophy." (Pat and Rex Freeman)

THE football competition.


Forget Fantasy football. It has nothing on the competition run by another one of our members, Nick Woolford, who is also a member of our green team.

54 members eagerly awaited the arrival of the President, who is looking very proud to have arrived just in time to start the proceedings!





The downside is that considerable thinking is required!




Medals and trophies were awarded. In Marios' case probably because he made Elaine laugh so much!
