that we couldn't help it. On the last end we couldn't rein in our charitable instincts and on three rinks we were overtaken and beaten by


rampant opponents smelling blood.

A good opportunity to recruit much needed new players.


Even if you indicated on the enrolment form that you could help on this day, please also sign up on the form in the club house for morning and/or afternoon.
