You may want to wait a bit for more practice but you can still arrange dates to play the competitions. Please note the new rule if you are unable to fix a date between you. It is on the board but I include here too as well as the rule on choosing rinks.





The challenger should approach the opponent in the first instant and offer 3 dates. If these are not suitable the opponent should offer 3 alternative

dates. If these are also not suitable and no other date can be found, the walkover will be decided by the throw of a coin.

To decide on the rink, on the day that the match is to be played all the available rink numbers are placed in a bag and the challenger draws a number out in the presence of the opponent or opposition skip.



At present

You need to check 2 things so it is particularly important that competition matches are arranged well ahead.

Look in the rink book to see that the session that you have arranged is available and not pre-booked for matches or by others.

Contact Mary Warner to ensure there is a free rink. You will probably need to book 2 consecutive sessions as each session is at present only 1 ½ hours.

Getting a practice game

Of course, hopefully things will change soon and we will be able to go back to our usual roll ups on a Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday club night.

Until then you need to use the pre booking system run by Mary Warner.

If you are not getting any games, you need to either phone around to a few fellow members and get 4 or 6 people together and then book a rink or find out who is booking rinks and ask to join in.
